SENTENCE CONNECTORS

Connectors help you carry over a thought from one sentence to another, from one idea to another, or from one paragraph to another with words or phrases so that there are no sudden jumps or breaks between ideas. Here is a list of some common connectors (it is best to check the dictionary or a grammar book to see how they are used):

2) above all (= most importantly)

He misses all of us, but above all he longs to see his family again.

Above all/ most importantly, don't forget to come here on time.

3) to a certain extent/to some extent (=partly)

To some extent, she was responsible for the accident.

4) to a great extent/to a large extent (= mostly)

<u>To a great extent</u>, people go on holiday there to enjoy the good weather.

5) in accordance with/ in agreement with

<u>In accordance with</u> your wishes, I changed my plan.

6) in terms of

The Richter Scale measures the intensity of earthquakes <u>in terms of</u> earth movement, while the Mercalli Scale measures the intensity of earthquakes in terms of effects.

7) <u>out of the question (= impossible)</u>

A trip to New Zealand is <u>out of the question</u> this year.

8) take into account/take into consideration/consider/considering/ in view of

We cannot adobt your plan for irrigating the area. First of all, we have to take into account the obstacles that must be overcome.

Considering his age, he has made excellent progress in his studies.

<u>In view of</u> the strong market, she invested in stocks.

9) beyond

Why he did it is <u>beyond</u> my comprehension.

We can do nothing beyond what we have done already.

10) depending on

Depending on what results are required, different methods are used.

11) concerning/about/with regard to/in connection with

The journalist wrote some articles concerning prisons and prisoners.

A small problem has arisen in connection with the renewal of the visa.

12) like/unlike

Erbil, <u>like</u> her sister, is very eager to learn new things.

Unlike Ali, his sister is quite pessimistic.

13) as far as concerned (= from point of view)

As far as we're concerned, you can go whenever you want.

He had been so ill for so long that, <u>from his point of view</u>, death was a blessing.

14) in proportion to/in relation to

The tax increases in proportion to the amount you earn.

15) together with

Plant disease, <u>together with</u> a prolonged drought, has ruined most of the crops.
